- 1. Be between 17-30 years of age.
- 2. Be pursuing a career in vocational trades.
- 3. Be in good standing in all areas of life, including home, work and school.

The Application Packet consists of THREE pages:

PAGE 1: Cover Page – Introduction, including:

- Name and Age
- Phone Number
- Address
- Email Address
- Education Level
- Career Goal

PAGE 2: Applicant Essay – Description of your reasons for applying for the scholarship and must include the answer to the following:

- What inspired your career goals?
- What brings you joy with your career choice?
- What makes you the best candidate for the Be Like Austin Scholarship?
- What obstacles are you currently facing in achieving your career goal?

PAGE 3: Letter of Endorsement: 1 professional letter of endorsement from someone who supports you in the pursuit of the Be Like Austin Scholarship, as well as your career.

Selection Process:

- Application Deadline:
 - o November 30, 2025 for January 2026 Award.
 - o March 1, 2026 for April 2026 Award.
- The Scholarship Recipient will be awarded up to \$2500 to support his/her pursuit of a vocational career.
- Scholarship Applications will be reviewed by Paul and Carrie Stanek, along with other members of the Be Like Austin nonprofit organization to ensure all criteria for the Application Packet are met.
- The Scholarship Recipient will be contacted directly by Paul and Carrie Stanek and invited to the next *Be Like Austin* fundraising event for recognition and celebration!
